For me it was like running a marathon, facilitating 5 workshops in a row, sometimes through two translators, while mentoring a young man from Cameroon, and travelling to four different places between two hours and two days apart. The two day trip involved a pickup truck that needed repairs, a lift on an 18-wheeler through the Kalahari Desert, a ride with a pastor from the Botswana border, a ride with a package delivery service, and finally the remainder of the trip with my colleague from the Namibian Bible Society. We had to slow down for hundreds of warthogs and a few kudus. In New Xade, Botswana, the workshop participants right away started a weekly storying club, while in Outio, Namibia, at least one participant used the story the next day in church. Even the Naro Bible translator from the Netherlands started telling his story at least once every day.

JUNE DICKIE Furlough, South Africa

We recently completed a 10-week Alpha course with a group of women prisoners at Pollsmoor. It went well and was a significant time for most of the ladies. We plan to continue with a post-Alpha course from August to October, focusing more on forgiveness and getting Scripture into use (through stories, songs, drama, art, memorisation, etc.). Our main concern is that the ladies learn to lean on the Lord and the promises of His Word, so that they can stand firm when they leave prison.

On the personal front, I am in discussion with leadership about my new assignment. Please pray for things to fall into place well. There has been no news of the shipment of the Kimwani Scriptures so I would value ongoing prayer for their safe arrival in Mozambique and no problems with their importation. Durk travels a lot, and for God's peace and protection for Sandy and their family, especially when Durk is away.
